**Title: All About the Continent of Africa**

Lesson Plan:	The Continent of Africa				
Subject:	American History				
Grade:	Kindergarten				
Description/ Abstract of Lesson	Students will learn about the Continent of Africa and its culture.

Objective(s):	<ul> <li>Students will:</li> <li>Develop an understanding for where Africa is located on a map and the shape of the continent on a map.</li> <li>Learn that Africa is the second largest continent in the world.</li> <li>Learn about the culture of Africa and how that culture transcends over into the African American culture here in the United States.</li> </ul>				
Materials:	<ul> <li>Digital resources</li> <li>Books, magazines and other resources made available by the school Media Center</li> <li>World Map or Map of Africa</li> <li>Crayons</li> <li>Printout of the Map of Africa</li> </ul>				
Duration:	<ul> <li>1-2 class periods</li> <li>Block Scheduling (90 min.) 1 class period</li> </ul>				
Lesson Lead In/ Opening:	Explain to the students that Africa is the homeland of the ancestors of many people living in the United States, the Caribbean and Latin America today.				
	<ol> <li>The teacher will display the map of Africa on the smartboard or a Large class map.</li> <li>The teacher will ask the students if they have ever heard of a place named Africa.</li> <li>The teacher will ask students, what they know about the continent of Africa, to probe them for prior knowledge.</li> <li>During the discussion, the teacher will write on the board what that students have shared based on their prior knowledge of Africa.</li> </ol>				
Activity 1:	Warm up or Do Now:  Students will watch the Nat Geo Kids video titled: Africa-Destination World from Youtube- <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PSYHMWmyVfo">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PSYHMWmyVfo</a> Group discussion: Students discuss with the class some of the interesting things that they say in the video.				
Activity 2:	Share a prepared page with a picture of Africa in the center. To further enhance the lesson, the letter "A" should be in the upper left corner with a caption that spells out the word "Africa". After appropriate practice, instruct the students to write a sentence using the word Africa in their sentence (They will write their sentence on the back of the paper).
